A Bit of History

Bonamanzi Game Reserve was proclaimed a Natural Heritage Site in 1995, recognized for its diverse habitats that provide refuge to threatened species, along with stunning natural features such as the panoramic view over False Bay, which forms part of the iSimangaliso Wetland Park.

Spanning nearly 4,000 hectares, the reserve encompasses a rich tapestry of fever tree forests, savannah grasslands, rare coastal sand forests, and swamps along the Hluhluwe River.

In 1952, Brian and Barry Kramer purchased 121 hectares of land to cultivate sugar cane, naming the farm "Bundu." As sugarcane farming expanded, the Hluhluwe Dam was built, and a breakwater was constructed at the mouth of the Hluhluwe River to prevent tidal saltwater from entering. The cultivated land was later expanded to accommodate pineapple farming.

Over time, natural areas were set aside for conservation, and hunting was prohibited. The first Tree Houses were built atop a rise with breathtaking views of False Bay. The name **Bonamanzi** originates from the Zulu phrase "Bona Manzi," meaning "See Water," reflecting the importance of water in this beautiful and diverse landscape.

General Safety Reminders

- Be vigilant of wildlife, especially Elephants, Leopards, Buffalo, Rhino, Crocodiles and Hyena
- Our accommodation areas are not fenced, so please keep a close eye on children.
- Never wade into any dams or waterholes, and stay well clear of the water line.
- Wear closed shoes and apply insect repellent for extra protection against ticks, spiders, and caterpillars. Malaria is not a concern at Bonamanzi, but still advisable to use insect repellent.
- Sulphur Ants: These ants are common in Zululand. They release a foul smell when disturbed, and caution is advised if you have a sulphur allergy.
- Vervet Monkeys: To avoid attracting these monkeys, make sure your windows and doors are closed when the room is unoccupied.
- For the safety of both wildlife and yourself, please do not feed or approach the animals.
- Bonamanzi Game Reserve and Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife have announced a ban on visitors bringing firewood into any of their reserves. Visitors can still purchase firewood from the curio shop, which has been safely sourced from areas free of the Polyphagous Shot Hole Borer (PSHB).

Load Shedding & Power Outages

In case of power outages, we've taken steps to ensure minimal disruption:

- 1. Generators will operate when necessary for your comfort.
- 2. Load shedding schedules will be posted on the **guest information group**.
- 3. Quiet Hours: To preserve the tranquillity of the reserve, generators will not run between 10:00 PM and 5:00 AM.
- 4. Water Supply: Power cuts can affect water flow, so please bear with us if interruptions occur
- 5. Sustainability: We prioritize the responsible use of generators to protect our precious ecosystem.

Housekeeping

We want to make your stay as comfortable as possible:

• Daily housekeeping includes bed-making, general tidying, and towel replacement (if left on the bathroom floor).

- **Self Catering:** Breakfast dishes are taken care of, but dinner dishes are your responsibility—dish soap is provided.
- Laundry services are available; please contact reception for assistance.
- Should you require babysitting services, please contact reception to arrange.
- Please report any **breakages** to reception.

For the benefit of the environment, please turn off the air conditioning and lights when leaving your accommodation. For optimal efficiency, set the air conditioning to $22^{\circ}C$ and keep doors and windows closed while it is running.

Embark on an unforgettable safari adventure with a qualified ranger, whose expert knowledge will enrich your experience as you explore the wild wonders of the reserve. Get up close to the Big 4 and discover the incredible biodiversity that makes Bonamanzi truly special!

- Arrive 15 minutes before departure.
- For afternoon drives, you can buy drinks 30 minutes prior and keep them chilled in the vehicle's cooler box. Enjoy drinks while watching the sunset over the bush
- Bring a jacket in case the weather changes.
- Keep phones on silent and maintain low noise levels.
- Tipping is customary Tip your ranger directly or add it to your room charge.

Night Drives

- For a truly magical experience, join us for a guided Night Game Drive! Our expert game ranger will share fascinating insights into the nocturnal world, uncovering the hidden behaviours of the reserve's wildlife after dark. Book at Reception for a safari under the stars
- Private vehicle night driving is restricted before sunrise and after sunset, except in accommodation areas.

Guided Birding

Bonamanzi is truly a birdwatcher's paradise, with its diverse biomes offering an incredible variety of bird species. While you might spot common favourites like hornbills and guineafowl, keep an eye out for rarer gems such as the Pink-Throated Twinspot, Lemon-Breasted Canary, African Broadbill, and more. Enhance your birding experience with a guided tour led by our expert rangers, who will share their knowledge and help you spot elusive species. Walking Trails

Bonamanzi is home to the Big 4 (Elephant, Rhino, Buffalo, Leopard). If you're planning an unguided walk, please stay vigilant for potential dangers, including poisonous snakes, hippos, crocodiles, hyenas, and even insects. Never walk alone.

- Always walk with a buddy and inform someone of your planned route.
- Stay on designated trails and within accommodation areas.
- Maps are available at reception
- To book a guided walk, kindly make your reservation through reception.

Self-Drive Safari Rules

To ensure your safety and protect the wildlife, please observe the following rules:

- 1. Respect for Guided Tours Guests are kindly requested not to follow game view disruption to the guides' activities and interference with their duties.
- 2. Stay inside your vehicle no hanging out of windows!
- 3. Stick to designated roads off-road driving harms the environment.
- 4. Keep noise levels low no loud music; enjoy the peaceful sounds of nature.
- 5. During periods of rain, driving may be restricted to the roads around the accommodation and Sand Forest areas. Large parts of the reserve are covered with cotton soil, which, when wet, swells and becomes extremely slippery. Cotton soil clings to vehicle tyres, making traction impossible—even for 4x4 vehicles.
- 6. An online version of the reserve map is available in the "Information" section through the QR code. Please be advised that if a vehicle becomes stuck, a recovery fee of R1,000.00 will apply.

Wildlife Safety

- Speed limit: **20-40 km/h** Wildlife can appear unexpectedly.
- Respect the animals they always have the right of way.
- Watch their behaviour animals with young or predators nearby can be unpredictable.
- Do not feed or approach wildlife. It's dangerous for both them and you.
- Littering on the reserve is strictly prohibited and poses a serious danger to the animals. Please dispose of your waste responsibly to help protect the wildlife and their habitat.

Duma Zulu (4 km)
